Regional Programme on Local Democracy in the Western Balkans 2 - ReLOaD2

Overall objective of the Action is to strengthen participatory democracies and the European Union (EU) integration process in the Western Balkans by empowering civil society and youth to actively take part in decision making and by stimulating an enabling legal and financial environment for civil society organizations (CSO).

ReLOaD in Western Balkans: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Serbia



Budget: €12.63 million (€11.35 funded by the EU and €1.28 from local governments and UNDP)



Partners: Ministries and institutions in charge of local governments and civil society in each participating **IPA** beneficiary



Project start date: January 1, 2021



The Actiont will collaborate with 63 local governments across the Western Balkans in implementation of 300 projects for 40,000 beneficiaries

29% (or 135) of 469 local governments in the Western Balkans expressed their interest to participate in ReLOaD2. The Action partnered up with 63 local governments.

Combined with partner local governments from ReLOaD1, there are **95** local governments engaged with ReLOaD programme OR 19% of all local governments from the Western Balkan region.



GOALS

ReLOaD2 is to strengthen participatory democracies and the EU integration process in the Western Balkans by empowering civil society and youth to actively take part in decision making, as well as by stimulating an enabling legal and financial environment for CSOs. ReLOaD2 started working with local governments by inciting them to use public funding for CSOs in a transparent and development-oriented manner, recognizing local needs and embracing a project-based approach. In the upcoming period, the Action will begin with the activities concerning the promotion of youth engagement. It intends to support implementation of youth initiatives and work on improvement of their economic perspectives in partner localities.



EXPECTED RESULTS



Strengthened capacities of local governments and CSO to institutionalize and implement transparent and gender responsive grant schemes and deliver good quality projects servicing the local community.



Enhanced capacity of local authorities and CSOs to generate greater civic and youth engagement in local affairs.



Enhanced regional networking and dialogue among civil society and local governments across the Western Balkans.



EXPECTED IMPACT

Working across the region, ReLOaD2 started enhancing capacities of local governments to engage in productive partnerships with CSOs. Therefore, local governments and CSOs will be able to **mutually contribute to improved** service delivery and realization of local priorities in line with development strategies thus subsidizing to higher quality of living in local communities.
